How to... look after your Acer

This is our advice on how to look after an Acer - the Pacific way! Follow our hints and tips and you'll enjoy these stunning trees for many years to come.

- 1 Acers can be planted in the ground or pots
- 2 If planting in pots use a mix of John Innes No3 and ericaceous compost for the most effective combination
- 3 Plant in acid to neutral soil perfect for this region
- 4 Do not overwater and feed with Vitax Acer Feed for best results.
- Once planted, Acers quickly take up any available nutrients, which then travel to the leaf tips and can lead to scorch (although they will recover after 1-2 years). It is a common misconception that scorch is caused by sun or wind. To avoid scorch, don't overwater.
- A semi-shaded spot is ideal but Acers also thrive in sun or shade.

 Note: We have Acers performing well in our gardens that are planted in full sun on an exposed site come and see for yourself.
- 7 Prune to shape, if required, in early Spring, just after the leaves have opened.
- 8 Look out for Greenfly in the early season. They are attracted to the sap at the stem/leaf joint and easily controlled by using Bug Clear.
